Assist Clients with Medication

Course Overview

Do you require your Assist Clients with Medication skill set, to better support your clients?

This skill set is for people working in various care and support roles in the community services industry who wish to develop skills in supporting people to self-administer medication.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the Higher Level Skills program, individuals must:

- Be aged 15 years or over;
- Be no longer at school;
- Permanently reside in Queensland;
- © Be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- Not hold, and not be enrolled in, a certificate IV or higher-level qualification, not including qualifications completed at school and foundation skills training; and
- Students must be an Existing Worker in the Community Services and Health industry, which includes parents and unpaid carers of NDIS participants. Additional student eligibility requirements are published on www.training.gov.au.

Higher Level Skills Program

The Higher Level Skills program aims to assist eligible individuals to gain the skills required to secure employment or career advancement in a priority industry or transition to university to continue their studies.

The Higher Level Skills program is funded by the Queensland Government to give eligible individuals a subsidy toward the training costs in selected Certificate IV and above qualifications.

Every student that participates in a Higher Level Skills course must complete a Student Training and Employment Survey within 3 months.

Student Contribution Fee

The Student Contribution Fee under the Higher Level Skills program is \$2 per unit (a total cost of \$4, concessional and non-concessional). This fee represents the total cost to the student to enrol, undertake training and be awarded the qualification.
